# MEi:CogSci Conference 2020

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### **General Information**

For the first time, a MEi:CogSci conference will take place online. The conference will include all the same points as usual, except transported into digital space.

### Summary

    - audio files (ONLY for presenters who cannot live stream video)

### Posters (2nd semester students)

During the MEi:CogSci Conference 2020, poster sessions will work as follows:

- each poster session is one hour
- each presenter will be assigned their own voice and audio channels on Discord
- all other participants are free to move between the different channels

#### **Time Windows**

To facilitate dialogue, poster sessions will be divided into smaller time windows.

- Each window is **15 minutes**
- Presenters are encouraged to start each new time window with a short introduction

   e.g. result or conclusions of their project
- Participants are encouraged to change rooms at the end of these windows

This structure is not mandatory. For example,

- **Do** start a new introduction in the middle of a time window, if a lot of people join your channel!
- **Don't** break off a stimulating discussion just because a time window has ended!

The time windows are designed to provide some structure for the poster sessions. Please use them as guidelines, but do not feel forced to adhere to them.

### Poster Format

Since this is a virtual conference, there are opportunities to do a few things differently. We encourage all participants to be as creative they wish.

Please keep the following points in mind

- only submit (zoomable) .pdf-files
- send your final poster to meicogsci@univie.ac.at by June 15<sup>th</sup>, 2020
  - subject line "2020 conference poster"

### Talks (4th semester students)

During the MEi:CogSci Conference 2020, student talk sessions will work as follows:

- conducted via Zoom
  - each session will have a unique meeting ID (available on Discord)
  - change of moderator between presentations to allow the next presenter to share her/his/their screen
- four parallel tracks
- three talks per session
  - **20 minutes per talk** (15 min. presentation + 5 min. discussion)
  - o 15 minutes time buffer
- each session will be moderated by a teaching member of the MEi:CogSci community

#### **Presentation Format**

Presentations will take place as follows:

- presenters are expected to prepare slides
- these should be presented on their screen, which presenters can share via Zoom
- presentations will be live
  - if you are scheduled for a student talk, please contact <u>meicogsci@univie.ac.at</u> immediately, if you know your internet connection will not allow you to present live. We will work out an alternative for you, depending on your circumstances.
